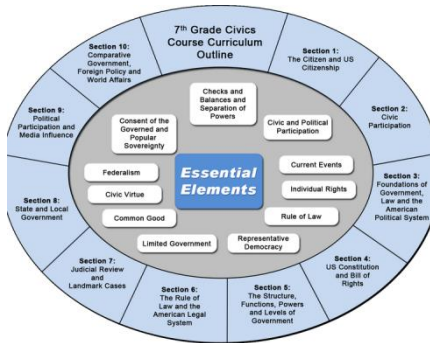

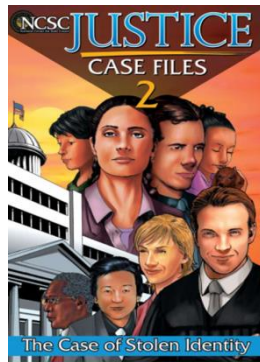
Resources for K-12 Audiences
